

Literacy & Education

- 13 Grow a Reader early literacy classes offered each week in Stafford, plus monthly evening and weekend programs, 31 classes system-wide
- PAWS for Reading offered at 5 branches monthly including Porter and Howell
- Hundreds participate in Read Across America events honoring Dr. Seuss and celebrating literacy with stories and educational activities
- 652 students participate in Cafe Book discussion groups in all 8 Stafford middle schools
- Over 9,000 people of all ages signed up for Summer Reading in 2017





Literacy & Education

- Classroom Carryout provides curriculum support for area teachers
- Bi-annual Early Childhood Education workshops provide early childhood educators two hours of credit for state licensing requirements
- 1,236 tests proctored for high school, college, post-grad courses; homeschool students; driving schools





Workforce Development

- 911 users logged 4,895 learning sessions and viewed a total of 25,453 videos on Lynda.com, averaging 70 new users a month
- 721 customers took a Training on Demand computer literacy class
- Provided 57 resume writing and job searching sessions at Howell's Job Help Center, offered in partnership with Rappahannock Goodwill Industries





Lifelong Learning & Experiences

- 130 local authors and authors-to-be attend first Writers Conference
- Financial literacy workshops and services provided in partnership with AARP, Rappahannock United Way, Virginia Credit Union, Small Business Administration, and others
- 6,396 participants attended 395 sessions in CRRL MakerLabs where we provide STEM exploration space for all ages and training on 3D printers and sewing machines for customers to reserve for their own use





Lifelong Learning & Experiences

- Meet the Moon & Solar Eclipse events provide family immersion in science:
 3,050 safety glasses distributed for the solar eclipse event
 155 Meet the Moon attendees
- 761 attended grant-supported World War I & America events
- Vietnam War Community Discussion part of grant-supported Vietnam War programming





Reaching Out to Our Community

- Students received 800 library cards through our annual Kindergarten Library Card Campaign
- CRRL staff attend Back to School Night, Orientation, and Business Night events at area schools
- Early literacy classes and rotating collections of books offered at 17 preschools, 26 childcare facilities, one home childcare, and Head Start programs throughout our service area.
- DMV Connect partnership provides state services at the library





Reaching Out to Our Community

- CRRL community gardens donated 3,500 lbs of fresh produce to local food banks and pantries
- Summer Meal Programs: Partnership with the Heartwood Center provided 3 lunch bags representing 6 days worth of breakfasts, lunches, snacks, & drinks: A total of 15,816 meals to 179 children from 77 families over 9 weeks
- 169 attended Health Fair connecting individuals to community health and wellness resources
- Hosting Community Conversations panels on topics such as civility and public safety





Reaching Out to Our Community

- 855 tax returns filed returning over \$700,000 to Stafford County residents via Rappahannock United Way and AARP Tax Clinics in our branches
- Over 13,500 local residents reached at 54 community events and festivals
- New mobile app extends library service for customers on the go
- 18,500 copies of @ Your Library distributed to customers throughout the community





Grants

- Received \$18,000 grant from The Duff McDuff Green J. Fund of The Community Foundation of the Rappahannock River Region for our future Library on the Go pop-up library initiative
- Grant from the American Library Association, PBS and WETA Washington, D.C. to support Vietnam War programming
- Grant from The National Endowment for the Humanities, The Gilder Lehrman Institute of American History, and the National World War I Museum for World War I and America events
