

Widewater State Park to Bring More Public Access to the Potomac

Virginia's newest state park, Widewater State Park, will bring more access to the Potomac for the public. The park will be a tremendous asset to Stafford County and will provide numerous recreational opportunities for citizens and visitors. Widewater State Park is located on the Widewater peninsula, bordered on one side by the Potomac River and by Aquia Creek on the other side. The project will be built in three phases. A groundbreaking was held on December 16, 2016, for Phase I of the project. Phase I will include a boat launch, fishing pier, bank fishing, canoe launches/ landings, trails, playgrounds and picnic areas. Phase II will bring a visitor center, office space, trail enhancements and additional day-use facilities. And phase III will include building overnight facilities and an environmental education center. Phase I is expected to take around 15 months to complete, with the other phases dependent on the timing of future funding.

World War II Veterans Recognition Event a Big Hit

Stafford's World War II Veteran Recognition Event was the second most-attended simulcast event in the state. Virginia is hosting a year-long WWI and WWII Commemoration to recognize the 100th and 75th anniversaries of the entry of the United States into the wars. Stafford partnered with



the City of Fredericksburg and Spotsylvania to host an event December 8, 2016, at the Stafford Regional Airport to simulcast the state's special Special medallion from the Virginia WWI and WWII Commemoration Commission given to each veteran WWII event. There were 42 veterans in attendance - 40 men and two women. More than 150 guests enjoyed the breakfast and complimentary luncheon by Mission BBQ. The keynote speech was presented by USMC Maj. Gen. Craig Timberlake.

During Thomas Foley's time at Albemarle County, Albemarle received its third 'AAA' bond rating, making it a triple 'AAA' rated community, a very prestigious financial designation. 'AAA' is the highest bond rating given to localities, allowing those communities to borrow money for projects

at lower rates and freeing up money for other services. Stafford has two 'AAA' ratings from Standard & Poor's and Fitch and is aggressively pursuing a third.

Foley was involved deeply with developing a combination career/volunteer fire department, all under the auspices of the principles of high performance, a long-time practice in Stafford County. Foley is recognized for his skill in building regional and community relationships, a valuable skillset to have as Stafford and area localities move forward with regional transportation and economic goals.


Stafford's New Armed Services Memorial Set to Debut in July 2017

The construction contract has been awarded and a dedication date of July 15, 2017, has been set for Stafford's \$675,000 Armed Services Memorial. There's still time to buy a brick to honor your loved one and have it featured in the first installation at the dedication. Just send in the form in this magazine or buy a brick online at www.StaffordArmedServicesMemorial.weebly.com. Kline Memorials has been selected to build the memorial and will break ground

on the project on March 4, 2017. Thanks to the enthusiastic and generous support of the community, the Armed Services Memorial Commission and Working Group, a group of volunteers appointed by the Board of Supervisors, was able to raise the original goal of \$675,000 in only five months! Larry Silver led the way with a \$100,00 donation, followed by \$50,000 from the Russell F. Sullivan Family Foundation and \$25,000 each from Atlantic

Builders and Richard Ward, II. Encouraged by the community's response, the group decided there were additional features that would enhance the memorial and make it even better and committed to raising an additional \$163,000. Features include additional lighting, landscaping, pavers, a seat wall and an irrigation system. Of this additional goal, only \$120,385 remains to be raised and the community's continued support is encouraged.




