





## A Message from the Chairman

ith Quantico in our backyard and many other military installations close by, veterans and active duty service members and their families are integral parts of our community. Military families come from all around our country and enrich our community's schools, churches, workplaces and civic organizations. I am a Marine Corps veteran and I am very proud that Stafford County is building an Armed Services Memorial that will honor our active duty service members, veterans and especially those who made the ultimate sacrifice. Our Board of Supervisors has appropriated \$225,000 towards the estimated \$662,500 needed to build the memorial and our memorial commission is working hard to raise the rest of the funds. I look forward to its completion.

In other news, Stafford County has experienced several achievements since the last Stafford magazine was published in February. We celebrated Black History Month by unveiling a historic highway marker in memory of Anthony Burns, a Stafford native whose story of escaping slavery helped inspire the abolitionist movement.

Two Stafford efforts were highlighted in national magazines. First, an internal employee demographic study was featured in the March edition of the International City/County Management Association's Public Management magazine. Second, Stafford performed a study documenting 30 slavery-related buildings and sites in the hopes of preserving them. This study was mentioned in the spring 2016 edition of the National Trust's magazine Preservation.

Our Purchase of Development Rights Program acquires conser-

vation easements offered by citizens that limit future residential development. We recently added more land to the program, bringing the total number of acres in the program to 347 acres and retiring a total of 90 development rights. If you include Crow's Nest Natural Area Preserve, Widewater State Park, Chichester and Duff Green county parks, Stafford has saved more than 4,710 acres from development.

You've probably noticed we installed trailblazing signs this spring with the County's logo and colors to identify Stafford's many visitor attractions such as Potomac Winery, Belmont and Curtis Park. The

signs are in addition to the previously installed gateway signs which welcome visitors into Stafford County. The official signs are easy to spot and make it easier for visitors to navigate, aiding our tourism efforts.

We held a ribbon cutting for the opening of the rectangular fields at Embrey



Mill Park. 170 teams and more than 2,700 players participated in a St. Paddy's Day tournament held at Embrey Mill Park and throughout the county, boosting sports tourism and the local economy. The Jeff Rouse Swim and Sport Center at Embrey Mill Park will open this spring and will feature three pools, exercise rooms, basketball courts and much more. Lastly, we worked with Stafford County Public Schools to negotiate a joint contract with a health insurance provider to save taxpayer dollars on administrative costs while also being able to offer the same plans to all Stafford employees, whether they are County or school employees.

There's more good news on the horizon. We will open our newest park facility at Lake Mooney on Saturday, May 28. Facilities include a boat launch and restrooms and once the fish stock has matured, fishing will be allowed.

Plans are also in place to build Stafford's first universally accessible playground at Chichester Park and the playground is scheduled to open later this year.

Our Board of Supervisors worked with the Fredericksburg Area Metropolitan Planning Organization and the Virginia Department of Transportation to fund improvements to I-95.

> The HOT lanes are going to be extended; a fourth lane is being added south of Exit 140; and extra lanes and a new bridge will be added between to I-95 between U.S. Route 17 and U.S. Route 3. We are confident this will relieve congestion, reduce commute times and give our citizens more time with their families. As always, it's a great time to be a citizen of Stafford County. #### **New Memorial Will Honor Armed Services**

Donald Lamar asked Stafford County if his son, Marine Sgt. Donald Lamar, II, a Stafford High School graduate who was killed in Afghanistan in 2010, could be recognized for his service. Lamar, age 23, left behind a wife, Stephanie, and a daughter, Madison. Lamar's request inspired Stafford's Board

of Supervisors to appoint an Armed Services Memorial Commission to create a memorial to honor the fallen, those who have served and those who are currently serving.

A commission of three citizens was selected to plan the memorial: Lieutenant General Ron Christmas, a retired Ma-

rine and founder of the National Museum of the Marine Corps; Mark Dudenhefer, also a retired Marine; and Gary Snellings, an Air Force veteran.

The commission decided to hold a memorial design competition among Stafford's high school students as a way to involve the future of Stafford County in its past. Five designs were selected to serve as the inspiration and to be included in the final design for the memorial.

Kline Memorials was selected to design the memorial, which will be located to the rear of the Stafford County Government Center and Stafford Courthouse. The memorial and plaza will provide a stand-alone location to hold ceremonies, special events, and be a quiet spot for contemplation. It will be a lasting tribute in a location that will be easily accessible to citizens and visitors for years to come, on a scale the County has not undertaken before.

One of the key features of the memorial will be bricks that line the edges of the walkways. Citizens may buy bricks to honor their family or friends who served or are serving in the armed services. Bricks may be purchased at the Stafford County Treasurer's Office or through the mail, using the brick form
