

BACKGROUND REPORT

At its May 19, 2015 meeting, the Board adopted Resolution R15-131, which stated the Board's commitment to the paving of unpaved roads that are in the Secondary System of State Highways, and included a priority listing of the unpaved roads, four of which are funded in the Secondary Six-Year Plan (SSYP). Southern View Drive (SR-632) was the second priority on the unpaved road list and is fully funded for FY2016-FY2018.

Southern View Drive is a low-volume road and may be paved under the Virginia Department of Transportation's (VDOT) Rural Rustic Road Program (Program). Pursuant to Virginia Code § 33.2-332, the Program is a practical approach to paving Virginia's low-volume unpaved roads.

Fundamentally, the Program adds an asphalt surface to an existing unpaved road surface, and reestablishes the existing associated ditches and shoulders. Typically, the new hard-surfaced road is on the same horizontal and vertical alignment as the prior gravel road surface. In addition, a focal point of the Program is leaving undisturbed, to the maximum extent possible, the trees, vegetation, side slopes, and open drainage abutting the roadway.

In order to be considered for the Program, Southern View Drive must meet the following criteria:

- Must carry no more than 1,500 vehicles per day;
- Must be a priority (line-item) in the locality's approved SSYP if the funding source is from secondary system allocations.
- Must be used predominately for local traffic. The local nature of the road means that most motorists using the road have traveled it before and are familiar with its features; and
- Must have minimal anticipated traffic growth. The locality's Board must agree to endeavor to limit growth on roads improved under the Program, and cooperate with VDOT through its comprehensive planning process to develop adjacent lands consistent with rural rustic road concepts.

Southern View Drive meets these criteria and is a good candidate for the Program. Staff recommends approval of proposed Resolution R15-258, which petitions VDOT to improve Southern View Drive under the Rural Rustic Road Program.

A RESOLUTION TO PETITION THE VIRGINIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO IMPROVE SOUTHERN VIEW DRIVE (SR-632) AS A PART OF THE RURAL RUSTIC ROAD PROGRAM

WHEREAS, Virginia Code § 33.2-332 permits the improvement and hard surfacing of certain unpaved roads deemed to qualify for the designation of a Rural Rustic Road; and

WHEREAS, any such road must be located in a low-density development area and carry no more than 1,500 vehicles per day (vpd); and

WHEREAS, the Board desires that Southern View Drive (SR-632), from the intersection of Eskimo Hill Road (SR-628) to the end of State Maintenance, be designated as a Rural Rustic Road; and

WHEREAS, there is no planned or pending development that would significantly affect the existing traffic on Southern View Drive; and

WHEREAS, Southern View Drive is in the Board's Secondary Six-Year Plan (SSYP) for improvements and included in the Secondary System of State Highways; and

WHEREAS, the general public, particularly those citizens that own land abutting Southern View Drive, are aware that Southern View Drive may be paved, with minimal improvements, consistent with development under the Rural Rustic Road Program; and

WHEREAS, the Board believes that Southern View Drive should be designated as a Rural Rustic Road project due to meeting all the qualifying characteristics;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Stafford County Board of Supervisors on this the 29th day of July, 2015, that the Board hereby requests that Southern View Drive be designated as a Rural Rustic Road, and petitions Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) Residency Administrator to concur with this designation; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board requests that Southern View Drive be hard surfaced and, to the fullest extent practical, be improved within the existing right-of-way and ditch-lines to preserve the adjacent trees, vegetation, side slopes, and rural rustic character along the road in their current state; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Administrator, or his designee, shall forward a certified copy of this Resolution to the VDOT Residency Administrator.

BACKGROUND REPORT

Public streets in the County are often constructed in conjunction with an approved subdivision or site development plan. These streets are constructed under the observation of Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) staff and, to a lesser extent, County staff. Construction and maintenance of these streets are the responsibility of the developer until such time as they meet all requirements for acceptance into the public highway system. Once the streets meet all VDOT requirements for design and construction, and have the required number of occupied homes, they may be accepted into the VDOT Secondary System of State Highways. After this occurs, VDOT assumes responsibility for street maintenance.

VDOT's satisfaction, at the completion of construction of the streets, begins the acceptance process. The Board then adopts a resolution petitioning VDOT to accept the designated streets into the Secondary System of State Highways. The resolution is forwarded to VDOT for further consideration by local VDOT staff and VDOT's Central Office in Richmond. Following review and approval, the streets are officially accepted into the Secondary System of State Highways.

Grouse Pointe Drive, Orion Way, and Greenbriar Drive, within Grouse Pointe Subdivision, Section 2, have been completed and are ready for acceptance into the Secondary System of State Highways.

The developers of Grouse Pointe Subdivision, Section 2, are required to provide the administrative fee, maintenance fee, and performance surety as protection to guarantee the satisfactory performance of the streets for a period of one year. These fees and surety must be received along with the Board-adopted resolution prior to VDOT processing the request. Following VDOT's acceptance of the streets, the County releases any remaining security for road improvements.

Attachment 2 is the completed VDOT form for Grouse Pointe Drive, Orion Way, and Greenbriar Drive, within Grouse Pointe Subdivision, Section 2, located approximately 0.54 miles west on Grouse Point Drive (SR-2252) from its intersection with Heflin Road (SR-612).

Staff recommends approval of proposed Resolution R15-256, which petitions VDOT to accept the above-referenced streets into the Secondary System of State Highways.



BACKGROUND REPORT

An application was submitted for an outdoor entertainment permit to conduct a family picnic/fundraising event at 83 Woodrow Drive, Tax Map Parcel No. 41B-1-19, pursuant to Stafford County Code Sec. 4-36 *et seq*. The applicant, John Zorich, is planning to host a one-day event known as Widewater Beach Fest to raise money for the organization Final Salute, Inc. This organization was established in 2010 to assist homeless female veterans by providing shelter and/or rent, child care assistance, employment support, and other essential services.

The event is scheduled for Saturday, August 1, 2015 from 2:00 pm to 10:00 pm. and is promoted as a family event featuring team challenge competitions such as volley ball, foosball, and a lip sync battle. The requested participation fee will cover the cost of trophies and tee shirts, with the remainder being donated to Final Salute, Inc. Only solo artists will be performing this year, so there is no need for a stage. All attendees are urged to bring their own food as there will be no food trucks present at this event. The applicant anticipates the majority of the participants will arrive by boat, so traffic control measures have not been provided. A portable bathroom trailer will be on site to provide sanitary facilities for the guests, and trash cans will be located throughout the property for litter control.

As required by the County Code, on July 15, 2015, the applicant submitted plans for providing sanitary facilities, trash disposal, emergency medical treatment, and fire protection for the event. The appropriate County departments will review and approve these plans, and work with the applicant to ensure compliance with the County Code and State regulations prior to and during the event. In addition, all permits required by the Virginia Department of Health, the Virginia Department of Alcohol and Beverage Control, and the County will be approved prior to the event.

Staff reviewed the application and supporting materials, and recommends approval of proposed Resolution R15-287, which approves an outdoor entertainment permit for Widewater Beach Fest, subject to final approval of all applicable County and State permits.



Application for Outdoor Musical or Entertainment Festival Permit

To ensure efficient processing of your Outdoor Musical or Entertainment Festival Permit, please complete the entire application. The application is required for submittal at least ninety (90) calendar days prior to the date of the proposed event to allow adequate review time.

Applicant shall submit a current Certificate of Insurance naming the County of Stafford as an additional insurer in the amount of \$1,000,000. The County is not held liable for any incidents or lawsuits that are indirectly or directly related to the event.

The following sections are portions of sections from Stafford County Code, Chapter 4, "Amusements," which was enacted pursuant to Virginia Code Section 15.2-1200, for the purpose of providing necessary regulations for musical or entertainment festivals in the interest of the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens and inhabitants of the County.

Sec. 4-23. Violations of article.

Any person who violates any provision of this article shall be guilty of a class 1 misdemeanor. Each violation shall constitute a separate offense. The Board of Supervisors may bring suit in the Stafford County Circuit Court to restrain, enjoin or otherwise prevent violations of this article.

Sec. 4-24. Definition.

As used in this article, the term "musical or entertainment festival" or "festival" shall mean any gathering of groups or individuals in excess of twenty-five (25) persons for the purpose of listening to or participating in entertainment which consists primarily of musical renditions conducted in open spaces on private property and not within an enclosed structure or other structure designed to accommodate groups of persons.

Sec. 4-25. Length of performances.

Music shall not be rendered nor entertainment provided at a festival for more than eight (8) hours in any twenty-four (24) hour period, such twenty-four (24) hour period to be measured from the beginning of the first performance at the festival. (Describe how the event will proceed and length of time.)

2pm until 10pm, solo artists only, no band, no stage, no special equipment. The artists will play on my level "putting green" stage next to my Gazebo. It is elevated 6-8 inches off the ground. The structure has been in place for 5 years. This is a family event and will focus on family games, volleyball, human foosball, basketball, lip sync battle, sack races, children games, etc. Solo Artists include Willem Dicke, Hammer & King, Anthony James &

Maryann, Jenna Curry. The Lip Sync Battle will also take place on this "putting green" stage.

Sec. 4-26. Admission of minors.

No person under the age of eighteen (18) years shall be admitted to any festival unless accompanied by a parent or guardian, the parent or guardian to remain with such person at all times. (Describe how this will be addressed.)

This is a family, neighborhood and charity event. All ages will be in attendance as the neighborhood has all ages, from 1 to 95.

Division 2. Permit

Sec. 4-36. Required.

No person shall stage, promote or conduct any musical or entertainment festival in the unincorporated areas of the county, without first obtaining a permit to do so issued pursuant to this division.

Sec 4-37. Application generally.

Application for a permit required by this division shall be in writing on forms provided for the purpose and filed in duplicate with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at least twenty-one (21) days before the date of the proposed festival. Such application shall have attached thereto, and made a part thereof, the plans, statements, approvals, and other documents required by this division.

Sec. 4-38. Statements, plans, etc., to accompany application.

- (a) A permit required by this division shall not be issued unless the following conditions are met and the following plans, statements, approvals and other items are submitted with the application:
- (1) A copy of the ticket or badge of admission to the festival, containing the date(s) and time(s) of the festival, together with a statement by the applicant of the total number of tickets to be offered for sale and the best reasonable estimate by the applicant of the number of persons expected to be in attendance. (Describe how admission will be addressed.)

Saturday, August 1, 2015, 2-10pm. No ticket or badge of admission is required. No tickets will be sold. No admission will be charged. All neighbors, families, and friends may attend. Team challenge is a voluntary donation for a team if they elect to participate, the donation covers the costs to pay for trophy, prizes, etc. All proceeds to benefit Final Salute, Inc.

(2) A statement of the names and addresses of the promoters of the festival, the financial backing of the festival, and the names of all persons or groups who will perform at the festival. (Provide Information.)

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John P. Zorich, resident, Widewater Beach, and Board Member, Final Salute Inc. 501.3(c) Not for Profit Charity to support Homeless Women Veterans

(3) A statement of the nature and location of the proposed festival, the name and address of the owner of the property on which the festival is to be held, and the interest of the applicant therein. (Provide information.)

This is a family picnic event located at 80 and 83 Woodrow Drive, my personal residence, and supports a not for profit charity, Final Salute Inc.

(4) A plan for adequate sanitation facilities and garbage, trash and sewage disposal for persons at the festival. This plan shall meet the requirements of all state and local statutes, ordinances and regulations and shall be approved by the health officer. (Provide Information.)

Air Conditioned Bathroom Trailer, plus the neighbors and friends houses throughout Woodrow Drive, trash bins and trailers to collect trash in order to take to the dump.

(5) A plan for providing food, water and lodging for the persons at the festival. This plan shall meet the requirements of all state and local statutes, ordinances and regulations and shall be approved by the health officer. (Provide Information.)

No food will be provided. Individuals may bring their own picnic basket.

Water is available at 80 and 83 Woodrow Drive. Attendees may pitch a tent on the property to avoid late night driving.

(6) A plan for adequate medical facilities for persons at the festival, approved by the health officer. (Provide Information.)

Appropriate medical emergency kits are available at the property, at all neighbors residencies/boats, and on all 30+ visiting boats. Everyone has 911 on speed dial.

(7) A plan for adequate parking facilities and traffic control in and around the festival area. (Provide Information.)

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All parking will be on private lots up and down Woodrow Drive, no cars will be parked on the street, and there is no need for any additional traffic control as the number of cars is limited as most people live in the neighborhood or attend via boats.

(8) A plan for adequate fire protection. This plan shall meet the requirements of all state and local statues, ordinances and regulations and shall be approved by the fire marshal. (Provide Information.)

Every boat has fire extinguishers and additional fire extinguishers will be readily available on the property.

(9) A statement specifying whether any outdoor lights are to be utilized, and if so, a plan showing the location of such lights and shielding devices or other equipment to prevent unreasonable glow beyond the property on which the festival is located. (Provide Information.)

No outdoor lights will be used other than those already installed on my personal residence on my volleyball court and gazebo.

(10) A statement that no music shall be played, either by mechanical device or live performance, in such a manner that the sound emanating therefrom shall violate any provision of Chapter 16 of the County Code. (Provide Information.)

Any and all music played will be within the required County Code limits on decibels.

(b) It shall be unlawful for any person obtaining a permit under this division to fail or refuse to comply with any of the plans, statements or other documents submitted pursuant to this section.

Sec. 4-39. Copy of application to be sent to board members.

On the day an application for a permit is filed under this division, the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors shall send a copy of the Application, by certified mail, to each member of the Board.

Sec. 4-40. Applicant to furnish permission for entering property.

The Board of Supervisors shall have the right to revoke any permit issued under this division upon noncompliance with any of its provisions and conditions.







BACKGROUND REPORT

At its meeting on May 19, 2015, the Board adopted Resolution R15-131, which approved the FY2016-FY2021 Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) Secondary System Six-Year Improvement Plan (SSYP). The adopted SSYP designates safety improvements to Bells Hill Road (SR-631) as a priority. Additionally, the Board, at its meeting on April 5, 2011, adopted Resolution R11-102, which approved safety improvements to Bells Hill Road and authorized funding.

Following the approval of Resolution R11-102, some safety improvements were made to Bells Hill Road. The County and VDOT are now seeking to work cooperatively to construct additional safety improvements to Bells Hill Road. The proposed improvements consist of hardening the shoulders and the resurfacing of Bells Hill Road, enhanced road striping, and a pedestrian crosswalk.

Proposed Resolution R15-263 authorizes the County Administrator to enter into a project administration agreement with VDOT related to safety improvements on Bells Hill Road. Staff recommends approval.
