• Trail Improvements (Jay Rucker)

CW Reid said the gentleman who spoke at the previous meeting (Will King) left his job and became a consultant. Mr. King's trail group linked with a regional group; therefore, Mr. Reid requested this item be removed from the agenda.

• Fields for Pakhtun Cricket Club

Eric Futrell asked if this group would be coming back to the Commission? Staff reported Mr. Garnet Lalputan had neither contacted staff nor provided information regarding his proposal for cricket fields/programs in Stafford. Eric Futrell said he had researched Cricket and found there is little interest in this sport in Virginia and the US as a whole. Since PRCF has a number of underfunded programs, which are already popular, he believes youth are better served playing in existing programs.

After discussion, Eric Futrell motioned, and C.W. Reed seconded, to remove Cricket from the

agenda and consider the matter resolved, unless it is re-introduced by the public or a Commission member. Motion carried unanimously.

- School Board Liaison (Alyssa Halstead)
 - O The School Board has new property for schools and is asking how these properties could be used by PRCF before schools are built? Brion Southall said there is too much cost involved in temporary use of property: access, parking, grass, etc.; however, there is still a need for passive trails.
 - Is there a cross-reference program in place between SCPS and PRCF regarding concussions in children? Mr. Southall said it is parents' responsibility to notify schools regarding concussions.

• Jay Rucker: Thanks to Brion Southall and congratulations on his promotion to PRCF Director; went to Duff Park and talked with staff—they're doing a great job; didn't know this park had a race car track; soft boards need to be replaced on the deck that overlooks the river
